- Supports migrant organisations, campaigners and others to advocate for changes to policies that will make the system fairer and more human
- Supports organisations which ensure diverse voices are heard in debate around migration
- Supports work which deepens understanding of public attitudes and concerns around immigration and integration and develops responses

 - Are actively building power in communities
 - Have a record of community organising around (1) climate (2) economics (3) environment
 - Tackle intersections of climate justice with other causes such as racial injustice, legacies of colonialism, economic inequality
 - Consider wellbeing of staff and participants
 - Demonstrates why there is a need for this work
 - Have a good reason as to why their organisation or group is the right choice to carry out project

Funding theme(s): Democracy

Geography: UK

Aim of fund:

Supports political campaigns and lobbying with national impact.

Additional criteria:

- Funds work in three main priority areas
 - Electoral reform – ensuring citizen’s votes count and elections are fair
 - Open and responsive democracy – ensuring executive power is checked by effective parliament and power is share more with regions and communities
 - Democratic culture – aiming to create a democratic culture with respect for diversity, collaboration and informed public debate
 - “Speaking Truth to Power” – the bar for consideration of this work is higher than other priorities.

Additional criteria:

- Interested in funding campaigns and research applications which align with the goals of their [funding framework](#):
 - “A million more” - increasing participation to get one-million low propensity voters registered and to vote before next General Election
 - “Enabling everyone to vote” - ensuring accessible, easy voting system is in place

- shared learning allows us to both shape our future actions and to stop us from deepening and consolidating harm.

Additional criteria:
